





Prior looked to have another 70-yard pick-six for the Rattlers midway through the third quarter that was called back on a holding call.

Whitefield, who finished with 148 yards and three scores on 12 carries, would finish the scoring off with runs of 21 and two yards at the end of the third quarter, before the combination of a running clock and the entrance of Rattler backups to the game stalled the scoring completely in the fourth quarter.

Stokes, starting his third varsity game, struggled for the second game in a row, following a breakout performance in a narrow loss to Coachella Valley. The sophomore finished 7for-16 for 46 yards and two in terceptions, along with a fumble - three of the team's four total turnovers.
